DEPART MANILA

ARRIVE BARCELONA, SPAIN

Bienvenidos a Barcelona, vibrant capital of **Catalonia**, a land that retains its own distinctive language, culture and traditions. Upon arrival, we will be met and transferred to our hotel for some rest and dinner.

OCT 11 (WED) DAY 03

BARCELONA

After a restful night's sleep, drive by the lively **Rambla** and along the **Passeig de Gracia**, adorned with elegant wrought-iron street lamps and flamboyant Modernist buildings. Explore the narrow lanes and old squares of the Cathedral in the **Gothic Quarter**. Proceed to the hill of **Montjuic**, home of the Olympic Games in 1992. Reach the 17th century fortress on the hill with great panoramic views of the city and the harbor. Highlight is a visit to spectacular **Sagrada Familia Basilica**, the most prestigious and complex project of **Gaudi**.

OCT 12 (THU) DAY 04

BARCELONA • MONTSERRAT • BARCELONA

After breakfast, travel to **Montserrat** to see the **Black Madonna**, framed in an ornate setting and overlooking the church's altar. The **Basilica** itself, the **Atrium**, the **Chapels** within the Basilica and the **Black Madonna** are all of interest from an architectural, spiritual and historical perspective. The Montserrat's Boys Choir is called **L'Escolania**, known for their **Gregorian chanting**. The **Montserrat Museum** has works from the likes of Picasso, Dali, Miro, El Greco and Degas.

OCT 13 (FRI) DAY 05

BARCELONA • ZARAGOZA

Depart Barcelona for **Zaragoza** to visit **Plaza Del Pilar**, one of Spain's grandest squares. Free time to visit the **Basilica of Our Lady of the Pilar**, where according to legend the Virgin Mary appeared to St. James. We then call it a night by checking in at our hotel. Dinner and overnight.

OCT 14 (SAT) DAY 06

ZARAGOZA • SAN SEBASTIAN • BILBAO

From Zaragoza, head to the lovely **San Sebastian**, the "Pearl of the Cantabrian Coast" and the **culinary epicenter** for the Basque Country in Northern Spain. Walk around the **Parte Viejo** (Old Quarter), where every other door seems to lead to a pintxo bar. **Pintxos** are the Basque version of **tapas**. Tiny cafes and bars line their counters with platters of bite-sized creations, typically eaten with the hands and often served on a piece of toasted bread. **Must try!** Overnight in Bilbao, the great port city of the Basque Region.

OCT 15 (SUN) DAY 07

BILBAO • LOYOLA • GETARIA • BILBAO

After breakfast, we are off to **Loyola** to visit the **Basilica** and see the house where **Saint Ignatius** was born. Then drive through **Azpeitia** to reach **Getaria**, a charming fishing village located on a mountain slope. We pass through the **Catrapona Arch**, a medieval passageway hidden beneath the San Salvador Church. Back to Bilbao for overnight.

OCT 16 (MON) DAY 08

BILBAO • OVIEDO

One does not leave Bilbao without a visit to the **Guggenheim Museum**, an amazing feat of construction created by the North American architect Frank O. Gehry. Time to rest as we drive to **Oviedo**, capital city of the Principality of **Asturias**.

OCT 17 (TUE) DAY 09

OVIEDO

Our guided sightseeing features the **Cathedral of San Salvador** and an exclusive visit to the **Camara Santa de Oviedo** (holy chamber of Oviedo). Dating back to 802 A.D., it houses the **Arca Santa chest reliquary of the Sudarium of Oviedo**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Cap the day with a walk along '**Boulevard of Cider**' and try the famous local drink. Free time in the afternoon then we meet for dinner.

OCT 18 (WED) DAY 10

OVIEDO • SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA

Along the **Asturian coast** to the most important pilgrimage city in Spain and the second in Europe after Rome, a pilgrimage highlight – **Santiago de Compostela**, destination point for millions of people on their way of Saint James, also called, "**Camino de Santiago**". Together, let us **walk the last 5 kms.** to Santiago de Compostela. **Buen Camino!**

OCT 19 (THU) DAY 11

SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA

Enjoy a half-day tour to explore the most important sights of the city and to visit the **Old Town**, as well as the impressive **Cathedral** - the end of the Camino pilgrim's journey. Also visit the **Museum of Pilgrimages** which allows visitors to discover the fascinating history of the pilgrims of **Saint James**. The museum explains the importance of the Saint James' relics to the pilgrims and illustrates the cult of Saint James through ancient artifacts and religious objects.

But this capital city of the **region of Galicia** does more than nourish the spirit! Since they benefit from more coastline, sand beds and ports than their southern counterparts, Galicia's dishes use all manner of fish, seafood, sand and rock harvested crustaceans than any other region in Spain. Embark on a gastronomic adventure in search of the **Percebes**, **Pulpo de Gallego**, **Bogavante con Vieiras** and **Berbedechos!**

OCT 20 (FRI) DAY 12

SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA • BRAGA • PORTO, PORTUGAL

Bid goodbye to Santiago de Compostela and continue our journey to **Braga**. Here we see the **Bom Jesus Sanctuary**, the city's highlight. This baroque masterpiece is unique with its ornamental stairway, dedicated to the Five Senses and the Three Theological Virtues. Continue to **Porto**, situated on the **River Douro** and celebrated as the **Port Wine** capital of the world. Admire the multi-colored houses and churches covered in beautiful glazed tiles, as well as the iconic bridges. Time permitting, visit a Port Wine cellar.

OCT 21 (SAT) DAY 13

PORTO • FATIMA

After breakfast, travel through central Portugal to **Fatima**, one of the most important centers of pilgrimage in the Catholic world. Visit the impressive **Basilica** and join the faithful at one of the holiest sites and pay homage at the **Chapel of Apparitions**, which commemorates the appearance of the Virgin Mary to three young shepherds in 1917 at Cova da Iria in Fatima.

OCT 22 (SUN) DAY 14

FATIMA FREE DAY FOR DEVOTION

Since 1917, **Fatima** has been one of the most important Marian shrines in the world. The Blessed Virgin was given the title, **Our Lady of the Holy Rosary of Fatima** and **Year 2017** marks the **100th Anniversary of the Apparitions**. We are indeed blessed to be in this place to witness this momentous event.
